I'm trying to get the Catholic Church to withdraw its support of the Magis Center because it promotes the scientific argument. The Magis Center is run by Robert Spitzer, SJ. His secretary told me he was too busy to discuss matters of opinion. My interpretation of this is that Fr. Spitzer knows he is wrong. It will make the Catholic Church look bad because it was the Catholic Minister at Columbia who turned this matter into a legal conflict.
