I have a Ph.D. in physics and I suggest you read a physics textbook for # 1 to 7. However, I am willing to discuss with you your answer to # 8. My guess is that you see nothing wrong with the following quote from Stephen Jay Gould:

"Catholics could believe whatever science determined about the evolution of the human body, so long as they accepted that, at some time of his choosing, God had infused the soul into such a creature.
